Bed Turning – A Special Trunk Show. San Jose Museum of Quilts and Textiles Board Member Lynn Koolish shares a selection of quilts from the permanent collection of the SJMQT. Enjoy this unique opportunity to hear about their history.

SPECIAL EXHIBIT

Off the Wall: Maverick Quilts, from the Julie Silber Collection

One of today's most respected quilt authorities, Julie Silber curates this exhibit of 20 of her favorite, quirky antique quilts. The pieces all have in common an unusual twist on the ordinary,

a certain verve, and a gritty individuality rarely found in more studied and self-conscious quilts. These playful pieces demonstrate that all over America, original works of art may be as close as the blankets under which we sleep.

She is a qualified quilt appraiser of quilts made before 1960 and owner of Julie Silber Quilts, formerly The Quilt Complex. She offers a wide range of antique and vintage quilts made between 1800 and 1950, and has been selling quilts to businesses, museums, and individuals since 1968. Julie will give a tour each day at 1:00 at the exhibit.
